

# Landscaping Strategy

The landscape masterplan has been carefully designed to enhance the School's existing green spaces. Additional planting and landscaping will improve biodiversity and create more useable spaces for students to enjoy for years to come.

The landscape design concept is based on retaining the informal character of the School grounds whilst integrating a landscape of green areas and pathways with the buildings, so that they fit seamlessly into the surroundings.

A mix of paved areas and informal perennial planting will soften and improve the visual environment of the School, helping to transform some of the more dull and neglected spaces.

## Tree Planting

Thirty-eight trees have been identified as being in poor health and these will need to be replaced. Whilst we are always reluctant to remove trees, we have carefully assessed those that are no longer healthy, and we will replace these with 63 new trees'.



Indicative Landscaping Strategy

### Aims:

- Create green connections and long views bringing clarity to the masterplan.
- Design an axis from the green to the new entrance with a forecourt approach.
- Enhance the link between the Loop Road, pond and playing fields with landscape.
- Generous circulation between buildings
- Promote wellness and wellbeing
- Enhancement of existing and new green areas creates permeable site for wildlife.
